FROM THE FORMATOR

Formation takes its time

I wanted to take an opportunity to address a question I have gotten several different times in the last few months and from several different Fraternities in our region. I have been asked lately about "fast tracking" people into fraternity.

There are several scenarios where this has come up: - a person 70 or older wants to join the fraternity and there is concern for their age

- a person who is very well educated wants to join the fraternity and formation teams feel they already "know" the information they will study

- the fraternity is worried that if they make someone go through formation for 2 1/2 to 3 years they will "lose" them

Let's work through this in light of what formation in our order is supposed to be.

Let's look at the last concern first - we might "lose" someone. One of the reasons we form people over the longer time period is to give adequate time for discernment and formation. (We will explore both of those further.) If someone leaves formation it is usually because the Franciscan vocation is not something they are called to live. If someone leaves, they were not ready to live out this vocation for the rest of their lives. This is not a failure in the fraternity. This is formation working the way it is supposed to work.

I know we are all concerned about declining numbers and building our fraternities, but we want to trust that God will call those people into the vocation that He wants. Our job is to be welcoming, open and true to the Franciscan way of life. The fullness of our life is beautiful and enlivening - that is what we are called to share with those in initial formation.

Let's look at the age dilemma. We think we are being kind to "fast track" an older individual. I can speak from the experience of 20 years on the formation team in my fraternity. The oldest person who went through formation was 81 when she professed. She went through the full 3 years in our fraternity's formation. It was a rich and joyful time of formation for her and her family was very impacted by her vocation.

In my fraternity, there has twice been a situation when we have professed someone in formation who was terminally ill prior to their death. This is a very different situation, but one where we are allowed to bring someone into the fraternity early so they may be professed before they die. These were meaningful for the fraternity and for the individual as they died fully professed.

In the last scenario above, it is important to focus on what happens in formation. In a combination of reading, time with fraternity, time in dialogue and time in prayer; persons in formation are asked to begin looking at life from a Franciscan perspective. As they talk with us in Formation, spend time in regular personal prayer and yes, read about the Franciscan way of life we have a different end goal than a class would have. We are opening people in formation up to be formed. This is an act of the Holy Spirit as they began to change and conform their life to the way of a Franciscan. They also, along with the Formation Team, spend time discerning their vocation as a Franciscan.

To discern and be formed takes time. We cannot rush the work of the Spirit. It is important to take the necessary time for those in formation to make the changes in their lives to conform and embrace the Franciscan vocation. Formation is less about studying than it is about Franciscan spirituality. There is no test, only dialogue that helps the Formation team and Council discern that true formation has taken place in the life of the candidate. Only then can we offer someone the gift of profession. As we must all keep in mind, profession is not the end, it is the beginning!



Franciscans International appoints new Executive Director

The International Board of Directors (IBD) of Franciscans International (FI) met in Assisi, Italy, from 11 to 14 May 2023. After significant deliberations, prayer and discernment, on 13 May, the IBD appointed Blair Matheson TSSF to be the new Executive Director of FI. He will replace Brother Markus Heinze OFM on 1 January 2024.



Blair is an Anglican Third Order Franciscan from New Zealand. He and Br. Markus will work together during the transition period from now until the end of the current calendar year. The Board recognizes the tremendous contributions by Br. Markus, who, over the past eleven years, guided FI through significant changes toward both organizational and financial stability.

The members of the IBD look forward to working with Blair and the dedicated staff of FI as we continue to stand up for <u>human dignity</u>, <u>care for creation</u>, and <u>promote peace</u>, defending human rights and raising these concerns at the United Nations and to the international community.

Pope Francis condemned "consumerist greed" and "selfish hearts" as responsible for the climate crisis in his yearly message for World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, <u>the Vatican announced on May 25.</u> Inspired by the words of the Prophet Amos, the pope chose "let justice and peace flow" as the theme for the Season of Creation, which runs from September 1-October 4. Francis said his message was inspired by an Indigenous and Catholic pilgrimage site in Canada, which he visited last summer.


